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Morticia's Washcloth

This pattern belongs to _____



*Morticia Addams made this washcloth for Gomez! ;-))
Have fun and make some – use them as a washcloth, as a dishcloth or even as
a basket liner!*

Skill level: beginner

Finished measurements: about 28 cm / 11.02"

Yarn: Sjuntpor mini Malou acryl cotton: [54% acryl, 46% cotton; 50 g / 1.76 oz = 140 m/ 153. yds], 1 ball of white and leftover of black
Or use what you normally use for dish – and/or washcloths

Other materials: tapestry needle

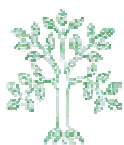
Scissors

Knitting needle size: 3,5 mm/ US 3

Crochet hook size: 3 mm / US - E

Gauge: is not important in this project

Pattern Notes



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The numbers in the () show how many sts on each needle.

Notice: when you BO on a row, the last BOst will be a part of the next group of sts!

Stitches - knit: **CO** (cast on), **BO** (bind off), **k** (knit), **k2tog** (knit two together), **Wtk** (short row - wrap and turn k-wise), **rep** (repeat), ***-*** (from - to)

"Short row"

k-wise - Wtk:

Step 1: k as many sts as required

Step 2: **wrap** the yarn in front of your work (towards you)

Step 3: sl next st k-wise

Step 4: put the yarn back to the opposite side (away from you)

Step 5: sl the st back to the left hand needle

Step 6: **turn**, k the sts as required

The Pattern

Body

Piece 1: CO2 with white

Row 1: k

Row 2: k1, kfb (3)

Row 3: k1, kfb, k1 (4)

Row 4: k1, kfb, across (5)

Row 5: k1, kfb, across (6)

Row 6: k1, kfb, across (7)

Row 7: k1, kfb, across (8)

Row 8: k1, kfb, across (9)

Row 9: k1, kfb, across (10)

Row 10: k1, kfb, across (11)

Row 11: k1, kfb, across (12)

Cut the yarn, slip the piece to the opposite side of needle

Piece 2: CO2

Rows 1 - 11: as piece 1

Row 12: k1, kfb, across (13)

Row 13: k1, kfb, across (14)

Row 14: k1, kfb, across (15)

Row 15: k1, kfb, across (16)

Cut the yarn, slip the piece next to piece 1

Piece 3: CO2

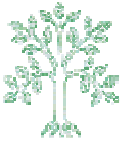
Rows 1 - 11: as piece 1

Row 12: add the three pieces as you have them on the needle and go on k across (12+16+12 = 40)

Rows 13 - 44: k

Row 45 - mouth: k18, BO4, k across (two groups: 18 - 18)





Rows 46 - 53: k on each group



Row 54: k18, CO4, k18 (40)

Rows 55 - 59: k

Row 60 - eyes: k3, k2tog, k10, BO3, k3 (but you'll have 4 sts including the last BO), BO3, k9, k2tog, k3 (three groups: 15 - 4 -15)

Rows 61 - 68: k on each group

Row 69: k5, k2tog, k4, k2tog, k8, k2tog, k4, k2tog, k5 (30)

Row 70: k

Row 71: k1, k2tog, k24, k2tog, k1 (28)

Row 72: k

Row 73: k1, k2tog, k22, k2tog, k1 (26)

Row 74: k10, k2tog, k2, k2tog, k across (24)

Row 75: k6, k2tog, k8, k2tog, k6 (22)

Row 75: k2, k2tog, k14, k2tog, k2 (20)

Rep last row until 10 sts back

BO loosely

Arm - make 2

CO2 with white

Row 1: k1, kfb (3)

Row 2 - and all even rows until row 28: k

Row 3 - and all uneven rows - until 16 sts: k1, kfb, k across (4)

Row 28 - short rows: k11, WTk, turn and

Row 29: k

Row 30: k10, WTk, turn and

Row 31: k

Row 32: k9, WTk, turn and

Row 33: k

Row 34: k8, WTk, turn and

Row 35: k

Row 36: k7, WTk, turn and

Row 37: k

Row 38: k6, WTk, turn and

Row 39: k

Row 40: k5, WTk, turn and

Row 41: k

Row 42: k4, WTk, turn and

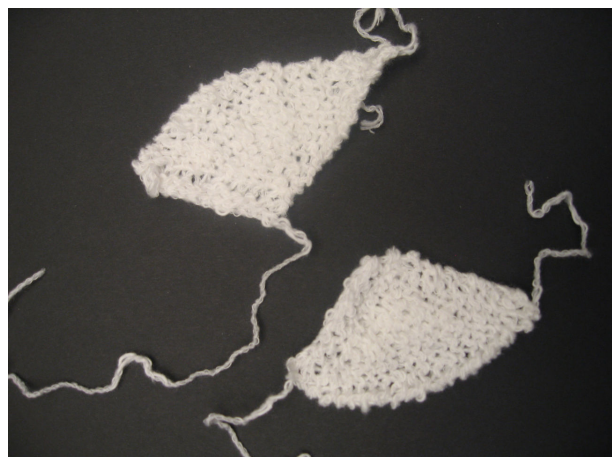
Row 43: k

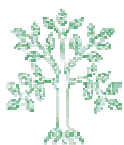
Row 44: k3, WTk, turn and

Row 45: k

Row 46: k2, WTk, turn and

Row 47: k2tog, BO, cut yarn and draw through last st





Eyes – Mouth – make 3

CO3 with black

Rows 1 - 10 (or 12 - as big as the holes in the cloth): k

BO

Ball

CO6 with black (2+2+2) and work in round

Rnd 1: *kfb, k1*, rep *-* around (9)

Rnd 2: *kfb, k2*, rep *.* around (12)

Rnd 3: *kfb, k3*, rep *.* around (15)

Rnd 4: *kfb, k4*, rep *.* around (18)

Rnds 5 - 7: k

Rnd 8: *k2tog, k4*, rep *.* around (15)

Rnd 9: *k2tog, k3*, rep *.* around (12)

Rnd 10: *k2tog, k2*, rep *.* around (9)

Stuff the ball and make the last rnd:

Rnd 11: *k2tog, k1*, rep *.* around (6)

Cut the yarn and draw
through the sts, pull

Chain – make 3 – 5 as you
like

CO2 with black

knit I-cord until 6 cm/ 2.40"

BO

Close this piece into a ring

Make another I-cord, but-
take care! -

before joining it into a ring,
pass the I-cord through the
first ring, then join the ends.

Make more chain-rings as
you like

Notice: close the very last ring in this way:

Draw the I-cord through piece 2 (Day 1)

then draw through the ring of the chain, and join the ends.



Patch – if you decide to make patches, make one for each side of the ghost,
so that you can hide the joining stitches. I made two patches in different
colours

CO4, k 6- 8 rows

BO

Finishing

Weave in the ends of the rings, add the ball to the chain

Weave in all ends adding the arms as you like
